## POST-PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS

## **BATHING:**

- You may resume your normal bathing tomorrow.
- You may resume your normal showering tonight.

### **BANDAGES:**

• You may remove all band-aids today.

## **ACTIVITY LEVEL:**

- You may resume your normal activities 24 hours after your procedure.
- If you took an oral sedative before the procedure, do not drive or operate heavy machinery for several hours.

## **MEDICATIONS:**

- Continue to take all your other medications as directed by your primary physician unless otherwise instructed.
- Pain medications should be taken only as directed.
- You should continue to depend upon your primary physician for your medical management of conditions not related to your spine/joint treatment.

### **NUMBNESS:**

- You may experience some numbness for several hours following your treatment. This means you should exercise caution in using those areas which are numb.
- You may notice a difference in the degree of numbness after each treatment. The effectiveness of the treatment does NOT depend upon the degree of numbness
- Do NOT apply heat or cold for more than 10 minutes at a time to the area until sensation has returned
- If you received a "numbing of your facet joints" today, call either Lauren or Matt in 4-5 hours to let us know:
  - 1. What percentage of pain relief you had in the treated area
  - 2. How long the relief lasted

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# POST-PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS (continued)

## **DISCOMFORT:**

- To help prevent discomfort at the injection site, you should apply a cold pack to that area for 10 minutes every hour up to 3-4 times the day of the procedure. No heat over the area for 24 hours.
- It is NOT uncommon for you to notice an increase in discomfort or a change in location of discomfort up to 24 hours after your treatment. If this occurs, apply a cold pack and take any medications your physician has prescribed.

## WHEN TO SEEK MEDICAL HELP:

- Redness or swelling around the injection site
- Fever of 101°F (38.4°C) or greater
- Drainage (pus) from the injection site
- For any continuous bleeding (some dried blood over the incision is normal)

### **FOLLOW-UP:**

•	Return to the clinic	
	<b>Remember:</b> It can take 1 to 14 days for the cortisone effects to really	start working.
•	You have been scheduled for your next injection	If you have complete
	resolution of your pain, please call and cancel your next procedure.	If your pain is unchanged
